Kazem Rahimi is the *James Martin Senior Fellow in Essential Healthcare* at the University of Oxford and Honorary Consultant Cardiologist at the John Radcliffe Hospital, Oxford. As the Deputy Director of the George Centre for Healthcare Innovation, he leads the **Essential Healthcare Programme**, which aims to find practical and affordable solutions for the global health priorities of the world’s largest emerging economies, as well as the priorities of vulnerable or disadvantaged populations in established economies.

He graduated in medicine from the University of Leipzig in Germany with postgraduate training in cardiology and health services research in Leipzig, London and Oxford. Prior to joining the George Institute, in 2010, he was a Research Fellow at Oxford’s Clinical Trial Service and Epidemiological Studies Unit.

His research interests include service delivery innovation in chronic disease prevention and management, large-scale complex intervention studies, and data-driven electronic decision support systems. He is the principal investigator of the **UNVEIL-CHF** study (*Understanding National Variation and Effects of Interventions at different Levels of Care in Heart Failure*), and the **SUPPORT-HF** study (*Seamless User-centered Proactive Provision Of Risk-stratified Treatment for Heart Failure*).
