Professor Martin Prince



Martin Prince is a Professor of Epidemiological Psychiatry and head of the Department of Health Service and Population Research, and joint-Director of the Centre for Global Mental Health at *King's College London*.

He trained in Psychiatry at the *Maudsley Hospital* and in Epidemiology at the *London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine*.

His work is oriented to the salience of mental and neurological disorders to health and social policy in low and middle income countries (LMIC), with a focus on ageing and dementia. He has coordinated, since 1998 the **10/66 Dementia Research Group**, a network of researchers, mainly from LMIC working together to promote more good research into dementia in those regions. The group has published work covering dementia prevalence, incidence, aetiology and impact and has contributed to knowledge of public health aspects of ageing and chronic disease in LMIC. He also led the development of the **World Alzheimer Reports** for 2009 (prevalence and numbers), 2010 (societal cost) and 2011 (early intervention) and was a leading contributor to the **WHO World Dementia Report** in 2012.
