Michael Brauer is a professor in the School of Population and Public Health at *The University of British Columbia*. His research focuses on linkages between the built environment and human health, with specific interest in transportation-related and biomass air pollution, the global health impacts of air pollution and the relationships between multiple exposures mediated by urban form (air pollution, noise, greenness) and population health.

He has participated in monitoring and epidemiological studies throughout the world and served on advisory committees to the *World Health Organization*, the *Climate and Clean Air Coalition*, the *US National Academy of Sciences*, the *Royal Society of Canada*, the *International Joint Commission* and governments in North America and Asia. He is Associate Editor of the ***Environmental Health Perspectives*** and a member of the Core Analytic Team for the ***Global Burden of Disease***.
