University of Bristol



Yoav Ben-Shlomo is Professor of Clinical Epidemiology at the School of Social and Community Medicine, *University of Bristol*. He qualified in Medicine from *St. George's Hospital Medical School* after having completed an intercalated BSc in psychology. He later obtained a Wellcome Trust Fellowship in clinical epidemiology and completed his MSc and then PhD at the *University College London* before moving to Bristol.

His major research interests are around life course influences on chronic diseases, especially neurodegenerative disorders as well as ageing in general. He was a co-PI for the **Halycon collaboration on ageing**, runs several cohort studies (**Caerphilly Prospective Study**), and is part of a large phase II RCT to evaluate the effect of losartan on brain tissue changes for patients with early Alzheimer's Disease (**RADAR**). He provides epidemiological expertise for two research teams (**Oxford PD-Discovery** and **Tracking-PD**) examining biomarkers and prognosis in Parkinson's disease. He is also one of the leads for the **NIHR CLARHC West and School of Public Health Research**.
